



Florida State Law 327.395

Boating Safety Identification Cards



In order to operate a motorboat of ten (10) horsepower or greater, *Florida law (P.L. 327.395)* requires anyone who was born on or after Jan. 1, 1988 to successfully complete an **approved boating safety course** and obtain a Boating Safety Education Identification Card issued by the FWC.



Florida does not have a "boating license." The Boating Safety Education Identification Card is proof of successful completion of the educational requirements and is valid for life.

29,359 Cards issued *state-wide* in calendar year 2012.



Visitors can get a ***temporary certificate in order to rent a boat or PWC.***



FWC “How to Boat Smart” manual

- Pick up the manual at your local tax collector’s office; study and take the exam at home; mail to FWC for grading and certification

Monroe County Boater Education Statistics



- Total Registered Recreational Vessels: **23,863**
- Boater Safety I.D. Cards issued: **355** (Source: FWC, 2012)
 - Completed USCG Auxiliary BS&S Class: **~700** (Source: USCG Auxiliary, 2012)
 - Completed USPS ABC Boater Course: **~100** (Source: USPS, 2012)
 - Online Boating Course completion accounts for **60%** of Boater Safety I.D. cards issued state-wide (all counties +/- 5%)
- FKNMS partners with USCG Auxiliary and USPS by providing education staff to give a 1-hour guest lecture specific to sanctuary regulations and resource protection as related to boating during most classes held in Monroe County

- Present Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary boating and boating education issues to the Boating Advisory Council
