


Alternative 1 - status quo

 Existing Management Area




Alternative 2

 No Anchor



Key Largo Existing Management Area/ Key Largo Management Area



Designated in 1975 as a national marine sanctuary, this zone encompasses an interconnected network of habitat types such as seagrass beds, shallow hardbottom, and coral reefs, contains 6 sanctuary preservation areas, and is located adjacent to other protected areas such as John Pennekamp Coral Reef State Park, Dagny Johnson Key Largo Hammock Botanical State Park, Biscayne National Park, and Crocodile Lake National Wildlife Refuge. This zone includes areas that prohibit spearfishing, marine life collecting, harvest of lobster, and recreational and commercial fishing.
